2010 King and Queen Spotlight

Jim and Kathie LaFortune are the 2010 Moscow Renaissance Fair King and Queen. They were selected to honor their many years of service to the community and the world. Thanks to Kathie for the following.

Jim and Kathie LaFortune moved to Moscow ID in the summer of 1990 as a result of Jim being offered a half time teaching position at MJHS. That may not seem like so long ago, but the principal then was the former custodian Alan Lee, and the current principal, our future superintendent, was just the humble band director.

Something in the water produced 2 children, Emerald in 1991, and Jasper to follow just after Ren Fair in 1994. Kathie quickly landed part time contract work as a pediatric physical therapist and the first 9 years in Moscow were a blur of raising young children, fitting in work on the side, and getting to know the new community. Kathie realized they were finally home the day Jim came home from the Moscow Food Co-op with a lifetime membership.

In addition to his passion for teaching and his young family, Jim began to fall in love with his new home state of Idaho. Not too far from the front door were ample opportunities for backcountry skiing, mountain biking, and whitewater. Still, skiing and rafting required at least 4 hours in the car, so Jim starting eyeing that big ridge to the north, known as Moscow Mountain. Exploration of the 2 wheeled variety ensued. So many gravel roads, so many abandoned skid roads, potential for single track and a border collie that could always find the car at the end of the day. Jim, knowing he could not do it alone, gathered a few like minded folks, and Moscow Area Mountain Bike Association (MAMBA) was born. What started as \$50 in the bank for tools, a few names of land owners on the largely private Moscow Mountain, hand drawn maps on scrap paper, and a handful of boys from Moscow with a dream, has turned into the MAMBA that we know and love today. MAMBA is known as the steward of the Mountain, most land owners gladly give permission for trails, down and dirty trail work with thousands of dollars in tools happens at least monthly from Spring to Fall, and your membership now allows you to download maps of Moscow Mountain with over 30 miles of trails for hiking and mountain biking (www.bikemoscow.org).

When Kathie wasn't feeding the bike explorations, or making cookies for the first (and final) Ren Fair MAMBA cookie booth, she was pursuing her own passions. Kids with disabilities lived with their families at home, went to school, eventually grew up and went to work. But what about play? Again, with help from like minded folks, Kathie made sure there was at least one accessible playground in Moscow, helped families write grants for power scooters or bicycles to access the paved trails, submitted evaluation after evaluation to get kids on horses via Palouse Area Therapeutic Horsemanship, and rewrote curriculum for her church's preschoolers when the church could not afford to purchase it. She continues to push, at the state and national level, to get kids out of their homes, into their communities, and outside in the natural areas beyond.

By far their biggest passion, and the best that Jim and Kathie have provided to the community of Moscow, is the addition of Emerald and Jasper LaFortune to it. They carry on a tradition of community service through environmental and international club activities, church youth group, PCEI, and the Heart of the Arts. As in the pursuit of their individual passions, Jim and Kathie realized very early, they could not do it alone. The Moscow Community has been the best collection of like minded folks, and is truly the village that has raised their children.

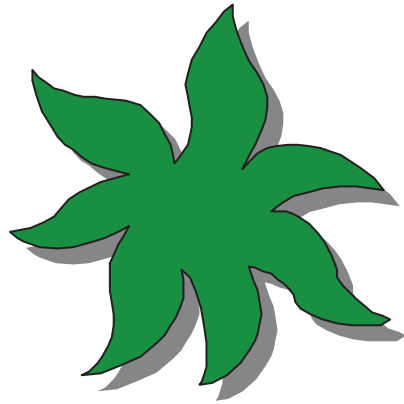

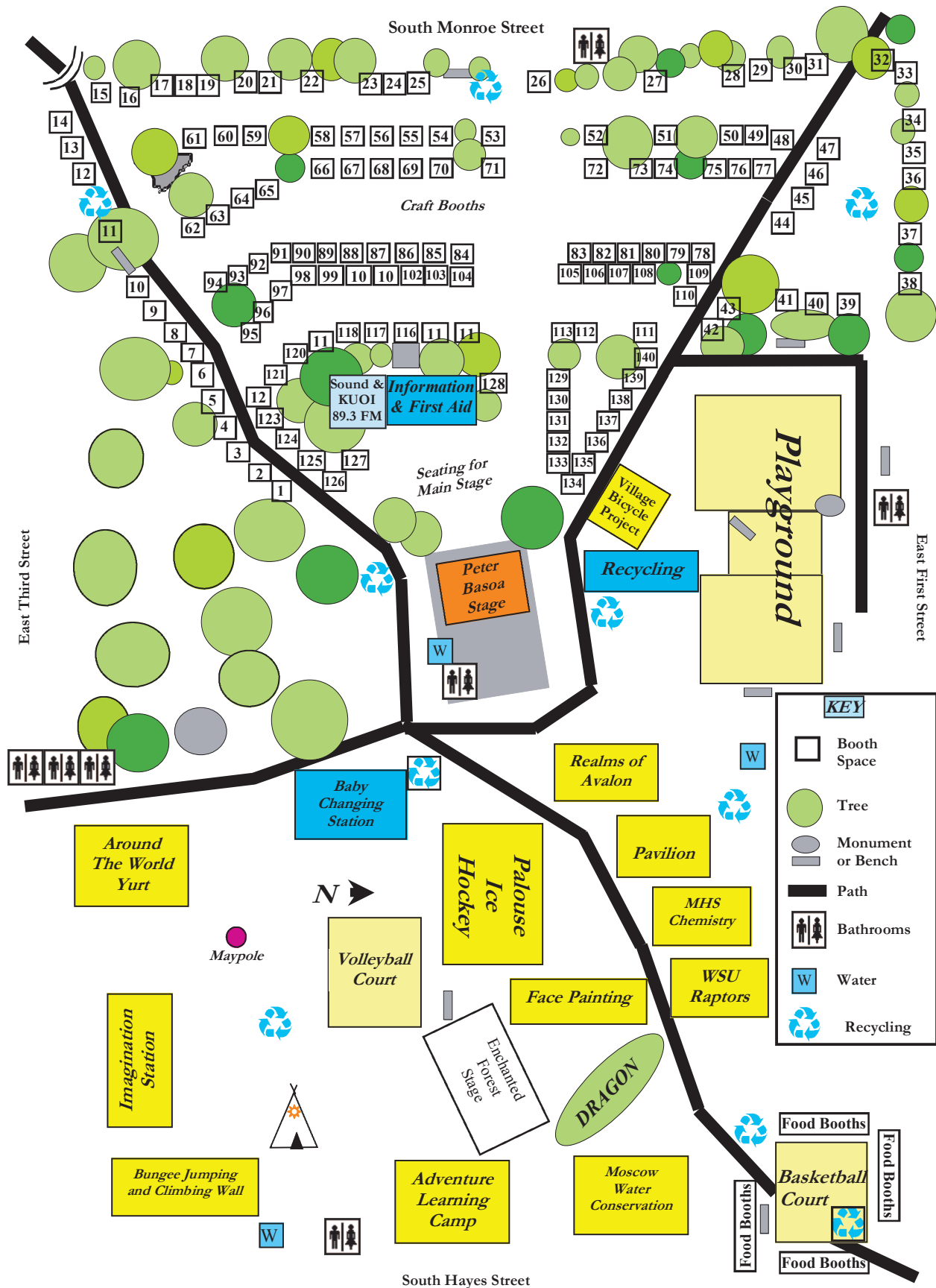
