John is the founder of Hyperspud Sports, and for 30 years has inspired others to have big adventures in the backcountry and around the world. He has supported local nonprofits and student groups by donating gear and apparel to hundreds of silent auctions and fundraisers. Though he has climbed in the Alps, Andes, and Yukon, teaching climbing at Pullman's Fifth Grade Camp is his (and Laurene's) favorite outdoor experience. He is also a skilled potter and craftsman and has a PhD in biochemistry.

According to the sign on her office door, Laurene is a lawyer and mediator — aka life coach, management consultant, counselor, facilitator, advocate, and teacher. She has served on the boards of several nonprofits here and on the East Coast, and currently serves the 1912 Center. In her off hours, she teaches and studies yoga, slacklining, and acrobatics.

John and Laurene are world travelers, multi-sport athletes, and independent business owners. Their farm at the base of Moscow Mountain features spacious skies, amber waves of grain, purple mountain majesty, and a fruited plain fertilized by sheep, chickens, and Albert the goat. They value the Palouse's natural beauty and Moscow's strong sense of community, and have been proud to serve both with their time, talents, and treasure. They are deeply grateful for the community's love and support during John's ongoing battle with melanoma, a highly aggressive form of cancer.

--- POSTER CONTEST WINNER ---



For the past several years, the Renaissance Fair has held a poster contest that invites local artists to create a poster design. This year's winner, **Janet Day**, of Chattaroy WA, embodies the renaissance spirit in spades.

Janet got an early start with art. Her mother was an artist, and as a child, Janet would watch her mother draw and try to recreate what she saw. This blossomed into a passion, which she decided to pursue formally when she was 36 years old. She studied graphic design at Spokane Falls Community College and graduated at the top of her class. She applied her knowledge to a range of pursuits, from designing t-shirts for bands to mixed media recreations of wildlife and people. She also created an entry for the Renaissance Fair in 2006, winning second place and having her poster displayed on the cover of the program for that year's fair.

Janet's mother passed away in January of this year, which inspired a great deal within her, specifically, this year's winning poster design. It was an idea that she has had for almost two years, however it was her mother's passing that has created an urgency to the need to share her art. When asked how it feels to have her design displayed on 500 posters throughout the northwest, Janet said it's "an honor to win. I know my mom would be proud." Janet is now working on launching a line of greeting cards, with the goal, "to remind people how important they are and how much we love each other." She has one piece of advice for everyone, "Go home and take a picture with someone you love. . . you'll appreciate it someday."

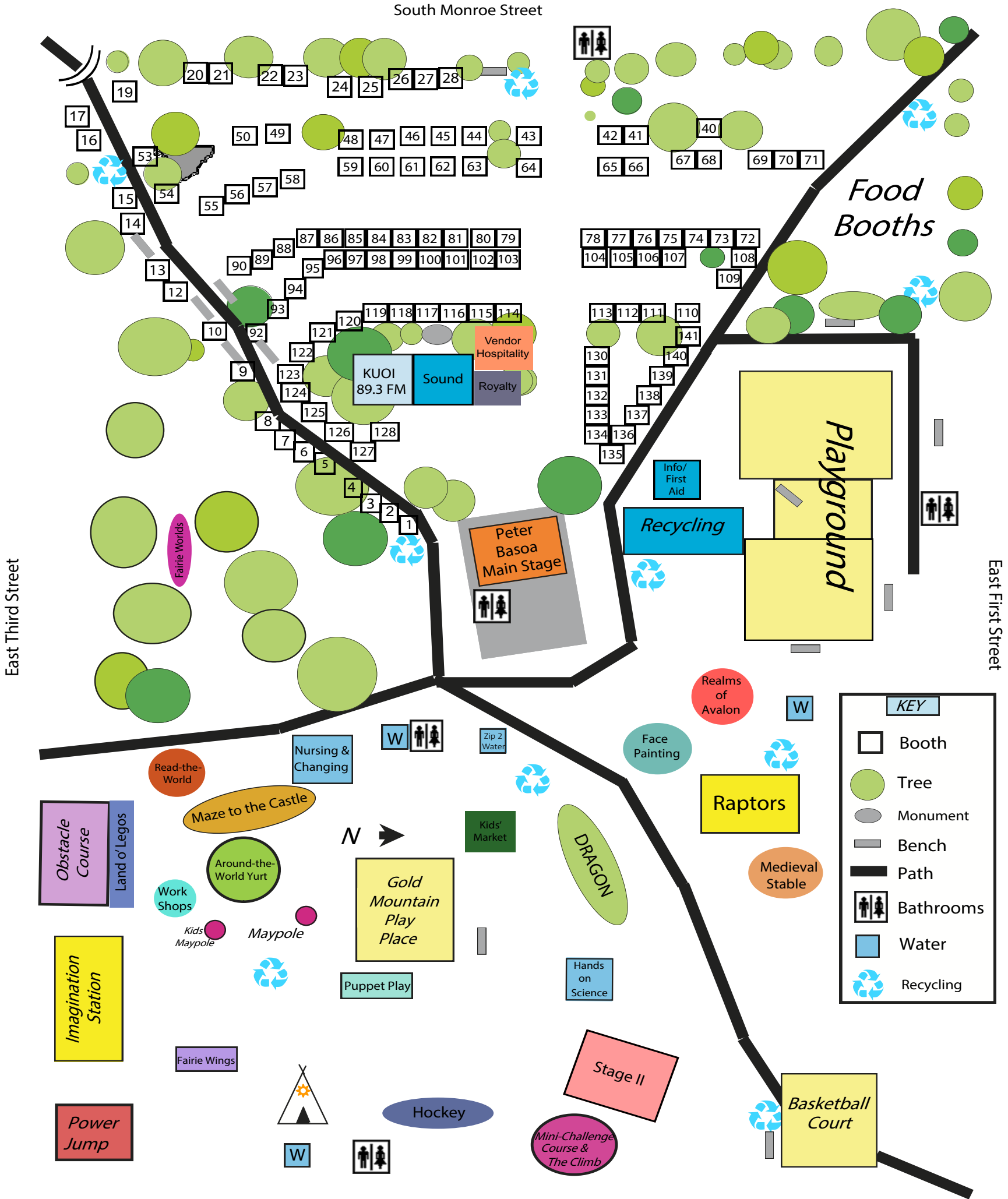


